TECHNICAL STANDARDS OF THE PAPERS

I. PAPER

- Paper should be written in English, single-spaced on standard-sized paper A4 with 1" margins on all sides. You should use 12 pt. Times New Roman font. Paper should include four major sections: the Title Page, Abstract, Main Body, and References.
- Line Spacing: Single-space throughout the paper, including the title page, abstract, body of the document, references, appendixes, footnotes, tables.
- Title Page: It should contain the title of the paper (14pt), the author's name & surname, institutional affiliation, and E mail address and continue next row with "body" of abstract. We recommend that your title to be no more than 12 words in length and that it should not contain abbreviations or words that serve no purpose. Your title may take up one sentence, one or two lines.
- Abstract: The abstract should be limited from minimum 200 to a maximum of 250 words (body of abstract)
- Keywords: we recommend you to use up to 8 keywords.
- Main Body: It is important part of paper and will include indent of all issues that are reflected in summarizing abstract from introduction, aim of your study/research together with research topics, detailed research questions, participants, applied scientific methods, tables, graphs, data analysis, used findings, and Suggestion and recommendations are another key point of paper.
- References: It will be according to the APA (American Psychological Association) referencing style. Please consult <https://apastyle.apa.org/>. It should be noted that only works cited in the paper can be included in the references section. Format: Justified, 10pt Times New Roman font, paragraph special indentation hanging by 0,63cm (+ 0pt space before, 12pt space after);
- Paper length: The length of the paper should not exceed 6,000 words including footnotes, tables, references and appendices.
- Paper Review: Manuscripts shall be reviewed anonymously by members of the Scientific Committee of the conference.

II. Authors' Bio

- Narrative Presentation: up to 200 words.
